<p><i>EDCI 580 – Introduction to Research (3)</i> This course introduces M.Ed. candidates to scholarly research and writing in the field of education. The emphasis is on understanding and conducting educational research for instructional improvement and professional development. It provides thorough exposure to theoretical and research literature and to quantitative and qualitative research methodologies. It also covers essentials of research project development, including development of topic, problem statement and annotated bibliography, review and synthesis of literature, collection and analysis of data, and use of APA style. Students conduct a literature review and draft a quality research proposal upon completion of the course. (Students should plan to take the course one year prior to enrolling in EDCI 590)</p>	<p><i>EDCI 580 – Introduction to Research (3)</i> Prerequisite: 6 credits of M.Ed. course work and permission of instructor. This course introduces M.Ed. candidates to scholarly research and writing in the field of education. The emphasis is on understanding and conducting educational research for instructional improvement and professional development. It provides thorough exposure to theoretical and research literature and to quantitative and qualitative research methodologies. It also covers essentials of research project development, including development of topic, problem statement and annotated bibliography, review and synthesis of literature, research ethics, collection and analysis of data, process writing, and use of APA style.
