For the last several years GEOG 337 has had a prerequisite, which is somewhat unusual for our 300 level thematic classes. The prerequisite has been useful at ensuring that students have already been introduced to central ideas, such as gentrification, urban redevelopment, zoning, etc. However, GEOG 237 is not the only class that consistently covers those topics. HISP 209, GEOG 231, and GEOG 237 can be used to fulfill the intro class requirement for urban studies and while they have different disciplinary perspectives (historic preservation, geography, and planning), they are all appropriate prerequisites for GEOG 337. This will decrease the number of POIs I fill out for Urban Studies minors and will help more students know that they are able to take the class, but should not otherwise impact the instructors or departments of the new prerequisites.
