Rationale

Supporting these offered concentrations has become impractical, given the current size of the MBA program and the available staffing resources. The electives in the concentrations are often cancelled due to low enrollment. Furthermore, accreditation and minimum enrollment concerns limit the ability to use adjuncts to fill needed staffing requirements. The elimination of the MBA concentrations will increase scheduling flexibility and the ability to offer the electives that MBA students want.

Eliminating concentrations with low enrollment will free up resources to offer courses and electives that have greater interest.

Impact Statement

The courses within the concentrations will continue to be offered as electives. New students entering the program can continue to take a series of courses with a particular focus, but without it being a formal "concentration". Since the courses will continue to be offered, but on a less frequent schedule, existing students in the program will be able to take the necessary courses for their concentration.

Teach Out Plan: We will continue to offer these concentration classes for the next two years and will reach out to the existing concentration students to ensure they have the opportunity to complete their concentration.
