I request that the attached cover sheet be appended to the application for a new course HISP 313 Museum Education, in as much as I have been informed that this additional request is necessary to achieve the proper administrative paperwork trail that such confirmation confers. The proposed class has been taught four times as a special topics course HISP 471-SS Museum Education. With the same title, contents, and objects, and faculty it was previously approved by the Museum Studies Minor Committee. Yet it must be reconsidered because it has been proposed to change title and appear in the Course Catalog.
